



David Lipscomb – Nashville, TN Abilene Christian – Abilene, TX Freed-Hardeman – Henderson, TN Harding College – Memphis, TN

Churches urged to support colleges from their treasuries:

A.C. Pullias - urged support for Lipscomb in 1947

<u>N.B. Hardeman</u> – claimed that church support for orphan homes and colleges stood or fell together. (1940's)

<u>**G.C.** Brewer</u> – known for his statement that "any church not helping ACC has the wrong preacher." (1935-1945)


<u>*Guy N. Woods*</u> – claimed churches could support the Bible Department of the college.

Orphanages

Potter – Bowling Green, KY Boles – Quinlan, TX Tipton – Tipton, OK Tennessee – Spring Hill, TN

Churches urged to support orphanages from treasury:

- *Emotional arguments* appeal to emotion, not Scriptures
- Men from Homes visited churches, met after services with members; the work was discussed & some private contributions were collected.
- Printed financial statements from Homes *listing churches, not individuals*, where money was collected.
- Falsely claimed that churches had been supporting them.
- Worked their way into some treasuries via 5th Sunday collection or box in foyer





House Church Movement

- **1.** Operating without a building of its own, the Boston church rented facilities for meeting on the Lord's day.
- 2. Then they divided their membership into house churches for other meetings.
- 3. The elders "delegated" authority to house church leaders to oversee these groups. "Many of these 'house churches' have long ago outgrown the 'house' size, having as many as 250 members.
- 4. Therefore, the two elders of the Boston church, still headquartered in Lexington, are in essence, "elders over a plurality of churches."
- 5. The Boston leadership was willing to lay aside the biblical concept of autonomy.
