




Exploring the Biblical Distinction between the church & the Individual

- Many voice the slogan "Anything the individual can do, the church can do"




Illustrating the Biblical Distinction

Matt 18:15-17

15 "Moreover if your brother sins against you, go and tell him his fault between you and him alone. If he hears you, you have gained your brother.

16 But if he will not hear, take with you one or two more, that 'by the mouth of two or three witnesses every word may be established.'

17 And if he refuses to hear them, tell it to the church. But if he refuses even to hear the church, let him be to you like a heathen and a tax collector.



Illustrating the Biblical Distinction


Acts 5:1-4

1 But a certain man named Ananias, with his wife Sapphira, sold a piece of property,

2 and kept back some of the price for himself, with his wife's full knowledge, and bringing a portion of it, he laid it at the apostles' feet.

3 But Peter said, "Ananias, why has Satan filled your heart to lie to the Holy Spirit, and to keep back some of the price of the land?

4 "While it remained unsold, did it not remain your own? And after it was sold, was it not under your control? Why is it that you have conceived this deed in your heart? You have not lied to men, but to God."




Illustrating the Biblical Distinction

16 If any believing man or woman has widows, let them relieve them, and do not let the church be burdened, that it may relieve those who are really widows.



- 3. As a Christian, I am a member of the family of God




Illustrating the Biblical Distinction

It is important for us to realize that an inspired letter can be written and sent to a church and, at the same time, contain instructions for individual Christians to fulfill




Illustrating the Biblical Distinction

- 1. 2 Thessalonians was written to the church at Thessalonica
- 2. But it also contains instructions to individuals
- 3. Note 2 Thess 3:11-12
- 11 For we hear that there are some who walk among you in a disorderly manner, not working at all, but are busybodies.
- 12 Now **those who are such** we command and exhort through our Lord Jesus Christ that **they** work in quietness and eat their own bread.


Instructions to individuals within the church



Illustrating the Biblical Distinction

- 1. I Corinthians was written to the church at Corinth
- 2. But it also contains personalized instruction to husbands and wives
- 3. Note 1 Cor 7: 1-3
- 1 Now concerning the things of which you wrote to me: It is good for a man not to touch a woman.
- 2 Nevertheless, because of sexual immorality, let **each man** have his own wife, and let **each woman** have her own husband.
- 3 Let the **husband render to his wife** the affection due her, and likewise also **the wife to her husband**. NKJV


Two Applications of this Distinction

Running a business


- The church is taught to raise funds by a freewill offering from the members on the first day of the week (1Cor 16:1-2)
- An individual can raise funds anyway he wishes as long as it is honest (Eph 4:28)
- But the church is limited to God's plan for giving (funding)

Social Activities

- Social activities are a duty of the home and family, not the church
- Christians in the first century spent time together socially but it was always separated from their worship assemblies
- There was an effort to eat together in a social way, as the church, but was condemned; they were told to eat at home (1 cor 11:17-34)




There is no passage in the New Testament in which social activities, even between Christians, are called "fellowship"



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- In the New Testament, there are 15 passages (depending on version) that contain the word "fellowship"
- Not a single one of them is used in a "social activities" context



Conclusion


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This lack of understanding can lead (and has led) to some rather unbelievable practices among churches of Christ. We now have:
