



There is no passage in the New Testament in which <u>social activities</u>, even between Christians, are called "fellowship"


Conclusion

The Work of the Lord's church is Spiritual in Nature


Paul wrote to Timothy (1 Tim 3:14-15)

14 "These things I write to you, though I hope to come to you shortly;

15 but if I am delayed, I write so that **you may know how you ought to conduct yourself in the house of God**, which is the church of the living God, <u>the pillar and ground of the</u> <u>truth</u>". NKJV

Roy Gogdill, in his book "Walking By Faith", Page 9, stated:

"No man has the right to prostitute the energy, strength, zeal or resources of the church of our Lord to serve <u>human aims or</u> <u>purposes</u>. The church should be **kept faithful to the divine mission** that was **God's purpose from eternity** for her to serve."



What the Work of the church is Not


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build gymnasiums, exercise classes

involved in Easter & Christmas plays drawing large crowds



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
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- Do these things please God?

There is no scripture that authorizes the Lord's church to engage in these activities




The standard of what is right and wrong is not what our society tells us.
